

AMY HASBROOK FAMILY LEADERSHIP AWARD

In honor of the 50th anniversary celebration of Title IX, the Hasbrook Family has endowed two, \$1,000 scholarships through the IHSAA Foundation that will be awarded annually. These scholarships are named in honor of the late Amy Hasbrook.

Amy Hasbrook was a student-athlete at Indianapolis Cathedral High School and later DePauw University who participated in girls basketball and was certainly a product of the opportunities that Title IX created. Amy tragically perished in a house fire in 2002. Her lasting legacy is the impression she left on those who knew her.

Awards have been established at both schools honoring her legacy. As a captain of the basketball team while at DePauw, she is still the Tigers' all-time leading field goal shooter at 65.2%. Amy was also a two-time member of the SCAC Honor Roll and Head Coach Kris Huffman refers to Amy as the "fiercest competitor she's ever seen."

The Amy Hasbrook Family Leadership Award which will be selected and presented to two female student-athletes from the IHSAA's 407 member schools who best exemplify and embody leadership, integrity, dedication to the team, and community service. These \$1,000 post-secondary scholarships are not only a lasting tribute to Amy but to that of the opportunities provided by Title IX. Thank you to the Hasbrook family for their generous contribution in providing a lasting tribute to Amy.

General Criteria:

1. The female student-athlete must be senior at an IHSAA member school who will graduate during the 2022-23 school year. The student-athlete must be planning to attend post-secondary education (4-year college, 2-year college, trade/technical school).

Supporting education-based athletics for the next generation.

2. The student-athlete will need to submit a short essay explaining goals and plans for the future, as well as achievements, setbacks, and character skills. A letter from the school principal or athletic director is also welcome.

3. The student-athlete must demonstrate a strong work ethic, leadership, and selfless dedication to the team and school.

4. The student-athlete is not required to be an exemplary student but must be in good standing regarding academic requirements to participate in athletics within the school and demonstrate an appreciation for academics.

5. This is a one-time \$1,000 scholarship awarded to the selected female, student-athlete for post-secondary expenses.
